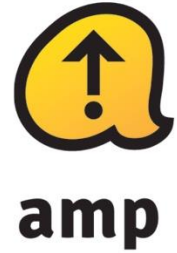


MEETING MINUTES



MEETING TITLE: Alliance for Marijuana Prevention

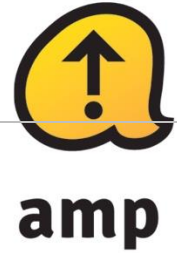

<p>Welcome & Introductions</p>	<p>Introductions were made at 9:20am Correction to April's meeting minutes - "letter verifying that the person has a condition to the state". Doctor does not have any liability for that card because he is just stating that the patient has a condition. Relationship is not defined between a patient and doctor relationship. Affirmative defense where they have to approve of it. " Jill Keast and Jason Carlson approved the minutes.</p>
<p>AMP Sub-Committee Meeting</p>	<p>DJ stated that the committee has finalized the panel list. 7 of which will lead a discussion of "an addict that has recovered from recovery", "an addict who has not recovered", and "parents who were affected by the addict". Jason Carlson will provide the committee with an individual who can share their story of what it is like going through treatment.</p> <p>DJ has been placed on the agenda for June 21st principal's meeting at MAISD.</p> <p>ELI Fox and DJ met to discuss this forum. ELI stated that Muskegon Community College is excited to partner and has offered the Overbrook theater and the Collegiate Forum on the 2nd floor of the college. Eli would love to have some of their students to attend. Hundreds of high school students who are taking classes at MCC (as young as 15) from the Early Start College Program would like to participate.</p> <p>Collegiate Forum (2nd floor) – can seat up to 300-350 students Overbrook – can seat up to 280 students. Food can be provided.</p> <p>Tech – live broadcasting opportunities – YouTube live stream on MCC's YouTube page. Utilizing the time and date that most MCC students are on campus will help build the attendance. ELI stated that MCC students are required to take a College Success Seminar – 10:10 – 11:30am. Committee can coordinate with professor to bring the class to forum, but we won't know definite until later in the summer. ELI – what time will work for the schools to view the live broadcast. ELI would love a date by early August 2017 to coordinate event. Brandon recommended they look into CUBE.com for live streaming options.</p>

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<p>Infographic Distribution</p>	<p>Questions can type it in. Something with google (google chat) would work with the high schools.</p> <p>ELI Fox - Theater would be higher quality with lighting and set up. Middle and high school. 7th thru 12th grade.</p> <p>Alison – have a contest/prize? DJ to determine how many students from the college and then determine how many seats are available for the middle schools. If we do a contest what will that look like? Will be very early in the school year (September/October) to conduct contest.</p> <p>Who to invite to the forum? Rachel stated that the infographic was sent to Workbox Staffing for distribution.</p>
<p>Policy Update</p>	<p>Muskegon County Resolution-State/Local Policy Update</p> <p>During the last Public Health Advisory meeting, Commissioner Nash and Mahoney will be pushing the Opposition Resolution on marijuana to committee. Jill stated that she is currently working on resolution for support for needle exchange.</p> <p>DJ stated that he has not heard back from any districts. Village of Fruitport is pushing against the ordinance and should do a Fruitport resident survey to gather public opinion.</p>

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Other Good and Welfare	<p>Opioid Summit in Muskegon – June 29th 3pm-6pm at the Folkert Community Hub Registration is now live for the Opiate Summit on June 29th. Maine currently has worst data numbers involving opiates. Jill stated that we should get her to attend amp because she is local and was appointed by Obama.</p> <p>Alison from the Red Project stated that testing strips for fentanyl are available at the Red Project in Grand Rapids. Four people took the test strips to test their heroin and 4 of them tested positive for 100% fentanyl.</p>
